The Council of the Parish of St. John the Baptist Parish, State of Louisiana, met in Regular Session in the St. John the Baptist Parish Government Complex Chambers, LaPlace, Louisiana on Tuesday, August 11th, 2020, at 6:30 PM.

CONSENT AGENDA:

ITEMS: Approval of Minutes - July 28th, 2020, Regular Meeting

MOTIONS: Councilwoman Houston moved and Councilwoman Duhe-Griffin seconded the motion to approve the consent agenda consisting of Approval of Minutes - July 28th, 2020, Regular Meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARING AND ADOPTION ON ORDINANCES:

20-18 (Public Hearing Held) An ordinance to amend Ordinance 96-141 to add the following Holiday: Juneteenth Day (Third Saturday in June) (T. Houston)

<u>MOTION:</u> Councilwoman Houston moved and Councilwoman Duhe-Griffin seconded the motion to approve Ordinance 20-18. The motion passed unanimously.

 $\underline{20-19}$ (Public Hearing Held) An ordinance approving the rezoning of Lot C, Elvina Plantation generally bounded by W. Airline Highway, Interstate 10, U.S. Highway 51 and Windsor Street, LaPlace from the Commercial District Three (C-3) and Residential District One (R-1) to the Rural District (RURAL), as shown in Exhibit

1 attached (PZR-20-1181) (J. Hotard)

Rene Pastorek stated, "This rezoning request to establish operation of a commercial dirt pit was recommended for denial by the Planning Commission at its July 20, 2020 meeting with a vote of 6-2 and 1 absent. The Planning and Zoning Department finds this request is consistent with the zoning district requirements, the Future Land Use Map, the intent of the Comprehensive Plan and meets the technical sufficiency for consideration by the Parish Council."

Councilwoman Duhe-Griffin moved to TABLE Ordinance 20-19 and Councilman Arcuri seconded the motion. The motion was withdrawn by Councilwoman Duhe-Griffin and Councilman Arcuri to allow Councilman Wright to speak.

<u>MOTION:</u> Councilwoman Duhe-Griffin moved and Councilwoman Houston seconded the motion to TABLE Ordinance 20-19. The motion passed with 5 Yeas, 4 Against (Malik, Schnyder, Torres, Wright).

 $\underline{20-20}$ (Public Hearing Held) An ordinance approving the re-subdivision of Lots 1 and 2, Cureau Subdivision into Lot 1A, Cureau Subdivision, located in the area generally bounded by W. Airline Highway, River Road, E. 24^{th} Street and E. 22^{nd} Street, Reserve, as shown in a survey prepared by Stephen P. Flynn, P.L.S. on May 25, 2019. (PZS-20-1245) (J. Hotard)

Rene Pastorek stated, "This re-subdivision request to enable the placement of a mobile home was recommended with unanimous approval by the Planning Commission at its July 20, 2020 meeting and by the Utility Board at its July 7, 2020 meeting. The Planning and Zoning Department finds this request is consistent with the surrounding neighborhood development pattern, the goals of the Comprehensive Plan and meets the technical sufficiency for consideration by the Parish Council."

MOTION: Councilwoman Houston moved and Councilman Arcuri seconded the motion to approve Ordinance 20-20. The motion passed unanimously.

20-21 (Public Hearing Held) An ordinance approving the re-subdivision of the John Esparros Tract into Lots 1-JE and 2-JE of the John Esparros Tract, located in the area generally bounded by the Mississippi River, the Y&MV Railroad, McReine Road, and Miya Lane, LaPlace, as shown in a survey prepared by Stephen P. Flynn, P.L.S. on April 30, 2020. (PZS-20-1243) (J. Hotard)

Rene Pastorek stated, "This re-subdivision request to enable the construction of an office building and continued use of barge mooring was recommended with unanimous approval by the Planning Commission at its July 20, 2020 meeting and by the Utility Board at its July 7, 2020 meeting. The Planning and Zoning Department finds this request is consistent with the surrounding neighborhood development pattern, the zoning district requirements, the goals of the Comprehensive Plan and meets the technical sufficiency for consideration by the Parish Council."

MOTION: Councilman Arcuri moved and Councilman Torres seconded the motion to approve Ordinance 20-21. The motion passed unanimously.

This resolution authorizes Parish President, Jaclyn Hotard to be appointed as the Director of the Authority for a term of two (2) years for consideration by the Parish Council."

The motion passed with Councilman Wright absent.
