WHEREAS, Article IV, Section H (2) and (5) of the St. John the Baptist Parish Home Rule Charter permits the Parish Council to adopt a resolution when authorizing a

designated person(s) to execute a previously approved contract on its behalf and/or to perform a ministerial act related to the administrative business of the Parish; and WHEREAS, the Regional Planning Commission for Jefferson, Orleans, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Charles, St. John the Baptist, St. Tammany, and Tangipahoa Parishes staff worked in partnership with three parishes (St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, and St. John the Baptist Parishes) to facilitate an application for Action Plan funding from the USDOT Safe Streets for All grant program; and WHEREAS, the Safe Streets for All program is intended to create plans that will reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries particularly in disadvantaged communities using a data driven approach and through community outreach activities; and WHEREAS, the Safe Streets for All application requested \$656,000 in federal funds (80% of the total cost) and \$164,000 of local funds (20% of the total cost), whereby local funds were agreed to be paid by the three named parishes; and WHEREAS, after discussion and quantification of total population, total square miles, and percent of disadvantaged populations in the three parishes, a proportionate local match was identified for St. John the Baptist Parish in the amount of \$30,000; and WHERES, the Regional Planning Commission agrees to develop a scope of work, solicit a consultant, and administer the USDOT Safe Streets for All grant. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the St. John the Baptist Parish Council, that Parish President Jaclyn Hotard is hereby duly authorized and empowered on behalf of the St. John the Baptist Parish Council to sign and execute the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between St. John the Baptist Parish and the Regional Planning Commission. The motion passed with 8 yeas and 1 abstaining (Torres).
