It is a great honor to continue serving you and the resilient people of St. John the Baptist as Parish President. Our first term review reveals that we persevered and delivered on promises despite unprecedented and unexpected disasters challenging us. We overcame the setbacks caused by a pandemic and a devastating hurricane and rebuilt and revived our parish to new strengths.

Our primary investment throughout 2023 was in bold, new infrastructure upgrades. We secured over \$120 million to comprehensively improve our drinking water systems, ensure better water quality, and improve reliability on both sides of the river. We overhauled our dilapidated wastewater treatment system. We commissioned a drainage master plan to address our drainage problems, an achievement 20 years in the making.

As we worked to enhance quality of life, our recreation department enjoyed record enrollments in youth programs, supporting the development of our next generation. Post-Hurricane Ida, we repaired parish buildings, fire stations, over 100 wastewater facilities, and streetlights, restoring normalcy.

As we look ahead, balancing community and industry growth is vital. With projected capital investments of \$50 billion in Louisiana, over 30 years, we will strive to remain competitive while preserving our community's uniqueness.

I appreciate the support of our council members and look forward to collaborating with each of them to enhance districts and better serve you. Prioritizing our community's needs, we remain focused on community engagement to shape the future of St. John the Baptist Parish together.

The Utilities Department supplies wastewater and water services to our citizens, businesses, and industries. It also monitors our water systems and makes necessary repairs.

Utilities is working on a \$60 million project to upgrade all parish Water Treatment Facilities and \$40 million in projects for wastewater.



## PUBLIC WORKS

The St. John the Baptist Parish Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining roadways, roadsides, drainage, and the collection of debris on more than 400 miles of roads, major canals, and ditches throughout the parish. The department's annual operating budget includes funding for solid waste, drainage, maintenance, equipment and roads and bridges.

Parish President Jaclyn Hotard continues to secure grants to remove debris from canals Parishwide. Phase 2 of the National Resources Conservation Services (NRCS) Canal Cleaning Project is nearly complete. To date, approximately \$2.5 million has been allocated for canal cleaning.







### PLANNING & ZONING

The Planning and Zoning Department works to shape the future of St. John by implementing the parish's plans and resilience projects, while coordinating with local, state, and federal policies. The department works with residents, businesses, and the parish administration to review and issue building permits, respond to code violations, and manage coastal and floodplain development.
